Subject:	Temporary Pesticide Tolerance Established for Fenbuconazole

Posting to NJinPASFRUIT: Temporary Tolerance Established for Fenbuconazole

Dow AgroSciences LLC (as Rohm and Haas Company) requested EPA establish temporary tolerances for <u>fenbuconazole</u>, in or on the stone fruit (except plums and prunes) crop group, pecans, and bananas be made permanent.

EPA has determined that it is more appropriate to extend them until December 31, 2004, while the Agency completes its review of data submitted to support the continued registration of fenbuconazole. Thus, EPA has extended time-limited tolerances for the combined residues of the fungicide fenbuconazole [alpha-(2-(4chlorophenyl)-ethyl)-alpha-phenyl-3-(1H-1,2,4-triazole)-1propanenitrile]and its metabolites, cis and trans-5-(4-chlorophenyl)dihydro-3-phenyl-3-(1H-1,2,4-triazole-1-ylmethyl)-2-3H-furanone], expressed as fenbuconazole until December 31, 2004, at which time they will expire and be revoked.
