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Subject:	Pesticide Application Records Forms Templates Available Online

This NJinPAS posting is the fourth in a series on New Jersey's revised code pertaining to pesticide control. The revised regulations were adopted and published in the New Jersey Register (the official journal of state agency rulemaking) on Monday, November 19, 2001. They are posted on the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Pesticide Control Program (PCP) website at http://www.state.nj.us/dep/enforcement/pcp/; to access, hit the "Regulations" hyperlink located on the menu on the left split pane at this web address.

The November 2001 revised NJDEP Pesticide Control regulations specifically outline additional information required to be recorded by licensed pesticide applicators in New Jersey. All licensed pesticide applicators are required to maintain application records of <u>any</u> pesticide applied, whether it is a restricted or general use pesticide. Additionally, licensed pesticide applicators must maintain records of the active ingredient used, as well as record of any applicator or operator on-the-job training.

As a service, we have developed template forms that incorporate the three types of required records into a single form. These forms are available on Rutgers Cooperative Extension's Pesticide Applicator Training website @ http://www.pestmanagement.rutgers.edu/PAT/record_forms.htm. These forms have been reviewed by the NJDEP Pesticide Control Program to be compliant with the November 2001 revised regulation changes in required records. The forms are an option and are not required to be used. If you choose, you may devise your own record keeping system as long as it is in compliance with the applicable regulations.

There are four forms available on the site:

- 1. Commercial Applicator Application, Active Ingredient, and Supervision Record
- 2. Private Applicator Application, Active Ingredient, and Supervision Record
- 3. Sample Landscape Record Form
- 4. Consumer Information Notice
